FAMILY RECIPE

This is a recipe from my grandmother's mother. It's my grandmother's sister's writing and is their mother's recipe from Sweden of this traditional Yorkshire pudding-type dish.

Fläsk Pankakä

4 or 5 eggs (beat well)	Combine these	Cut salt pork in cubes
2 cups milk		(1/2 in.) Put in skillet with
1 Tsp. salt		about 1 cup water. Let come
2 Tbsp. sugar		to full boil to boil out
1 Tsp. bak. powder		salt. Drain. Put back
2 1/2 cup Flour (approx) (1 1/2)		on fire & brown well.
1/4 cup oil or grease (from pork)		Drain off excess grease -
(about 1 # salt pork)		Pour batter over salt pork
		that has been browned -
		(may need 2 pans to bake). Best
		to bake in heavy skillet or pan - Bake
		at 150° (over)

I hope you can understand my recipe - (mostly from memory) - If you recall this is sorta like their "pankakä". Don't be alarmed if it looks tough, it's done - I think it takes about 20 minutes - not sure - tho'. Batter is quite thin - if not - thin with water or more milk - This you may have to revise but you can tell I hope! When it's done it's about 1/2 to 3/4 in thick - Be sure to grease baking pan if it isn't the one you browned pork in -
